A Peek Into Jamaica

It is reported that the famous explorer, Christopher Columbus, on seeing Jamaica for the first time, was immediately drawn to it and declared it: "The fairest isle that eyes hath beheld".

Historically, Jamaica was once the most famous important colony in the British empire and Port Royal laid claim to being one of the richest cities of the world. History also records that the island had its economic dominance in agriculture. Its destiny was etched in the land.

Jamaica is a microcosm of the world community. Here cultural plurality and unparalleled natural beauty are interwoven in a rich tapestry, distinct and distinguished, recognized around the globe as unmistakably Jamaican.

Jamaica is home to the largest population of Afro-Caribbean people in the English-speaking Caribbean. The people are endowed with remarkable talent, ingenuity and a proven capacity for excellence and innovation. Perhaps the most travelled of all former colonial peoples, our talents and contributions have influenced history and enriched the human experience all over the world.

Like no place on earth, Jamaica is the Caribbean's answer to the (famed) 'Garden of Eden'. It's natural beauty has fascinated visitors for centuries. There's a certain magic or romantic allure that brings people back again and again.

As the third largest of the Caribbean islands, Jamaica comprises 4,411 square miles and is divided into three counties (Cornwall, Middlesex & Surrey) and fourteen (14) parishes. The island is 146 miles long and its width ranges from 22 to 51 miles. An average rainfall of 78 inches directly affects its 120 rivers. Approximately 50% of the island is above 1000 feet.

English is the official language of Jamaica. However, most if not all Jamaicans speak patois, a mixture of French, Spanish, English and African dialects. Most of the island's population of 2.7 mil is of African descent and Christianity is the major religion.

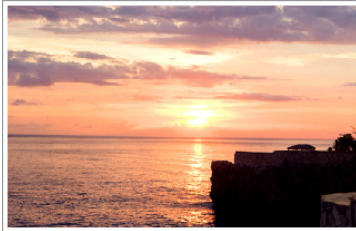
Montego Bay - 'The Complete Resort'

The Parish of Hanover



The parish of Hanover was born out of the parishes of St. Elizabeth and Westmoreland on November 12, 1793. It was named for King George 1st, the reigning monarch on the British throne who was from the house of Hanover in Germany. He had the dubious distinction of being the first King of England who could not speak English. In fact, there was talk of naming the parish St. Sophia after the King's mother. However, the Council would not hear of it. Lucea, the town capital, on the other hand was known by many names: Saint Lucea, St. Lucia and St. Lucea.

Hanover is the second smallest of the fourteen parishes and is located on the western end of the island, bounded on the east by St. James and on the south by Westmoreland. The parish is famous for its natural landlocked harbour and picturesque surrounding hills which forms a perfect backdrop to the Georgian structures in the parish capital. The parish has a population of 70,378.

The terrain for the most part is mountainous with the Dolphin Head Mountain being most worthy of note. Unlike other sections of the island that boast stretches of beautiful beaches, here you will find mostly coves and bays. Two rivers are in the parish, the Lucea East and Lucea West Rivers. The parish is also blessed with waterfalls – Dry Hill, Paradise and Kempshot.

In the center of the Lucea, as with all other town capitals in Jamaica, stands the clock tower. History records that this clock was originally intended for the eastern Caribbean island of St. Lucia. However, the captain of the ship confused both places and landed the clock – a gift from Germany for the people of St Lucia – in Hanover. Although they had ordered a more modest version, the townfolks refused to let the clock go. They made up the difference through public subscription. The clock was installed in 1817. Today, the clock, with the top of its tower shaped like the helmet worn by the German Royal Guard, remains a land mark in Lucea and it still works.

In terms of educational facilities, the story is told of Martin Rusea, a Frenchman, who willed all his estate for the establishment of a 'free school' in Hanover. This was done in appreciation for the hospitality shown to him by the people of Hanover when he was shipwrecked and washed ashore while fleeing religious persecution in his homeland. Today the Ruseas High School is a pillar of education in the parish.

Places to Visit in Hanover

Fort Charlotte – Built in 1761 for the defence of Lucea which was in danger of attack by French raiders. The fort stands as a peninsula overlooking the bay.

The Barracks – The impressive Georgian brick structure alongside the fort, built in 1843 to provide shelter for the soldiers stationed there.

Lucea Harbour – Considered one of the best and the safest in the island. It is almost completely cut off from the sea, with only a narrow channel at its entrance.

Blenheim – The birthplace of National Hero, Sir Alexander Bustamante.

Old Sugar Mill – On the main road to Lucea.

Dolphin Cove - This 20 acre property is the largest natural dolphin lagoon in the world. Visitors have the opportunity to interact and "Swim With" dolphins.

Chukka Blue - This tour allows you to travel through time as you pass the magnificent ruins of a 1700's Sugar Estate. Enjoy breathtaking views, and ride through the warm Caribbean Sea.

- 1884** New Constitution providing for semi-representative government
- 1944 – Nov 20** New Constitution – (Ministerial Government)
- 1948** University College of the West Indies (now University of the West Indies, Mona) founded at Mona
- 1962 – Aug 6** Jamaica achieves independence. Sir Alexander Bustamante as first Prime Minister & Sir Kenneth Blackburn as first Governor General
- 1962 – Dec 1** Sir Clifford Campbell, a Jamaican, succeeds Sir Kenneth Blackburn
- 2012 – Aug 6** Jamaica celebrated 50 years as an independent nation under the theme "A Nation on a Mission".

Our National Symbols & Emblems



COAT OF ARMS

The coat of arms, granted to Jamaica in 1661, shows the original Jamaicans; a male and female Taino, standing on either side of the shield which bears a red cross with five golden pineapples. A Jamaican crocodile forms the crest and sits on top of the Royal Helmet and Mantlings. At the bottom is inscribed The National Motto: Out of Many, One People.

NATIONAL FLAG

In the colours of black, green and gold, the Jamaican, national flag embodies the spirit of the Jamaican people when it first came into use on August 6, 1962, Jamaica's Independence Day. The colours of the flag symbolize the shining of the sun (yellow), the lushness of the land (green), and the strength and creativity of the people (black).



NATIONAL FLOWER

Lignum Vitae (Guaiacum officinale)

This is a beautiful blue flower that is mostly found along the North Coast and South Coast of the island. Christopher Columbus commented on its beauty when he first came here. The name means 'wood of life'. The Lignum

Vitae is indigenous to the West Indies and northern South America.

The resin is used for treating skin diseases and the wood for constructing propeller shaft bearings in ships. It also makes beautiful carvings.

NATIONAL FRUIT

Ackee (Blighia Sapia)

Ackee is often served with salted fish, to make the national dish- 'Ackee & Saltfish'. This fruit is not indigenous to Jamaica but was brought here by Captain Bligh, along with the bread-fruit, during the slave trade from West Africa.

The fruit grows on an evergreen tree of the soapberry family that was transported to the Caribbean from this region. Ackees have now become a popular export food crop.

NATIONAL TREE

Blue Mahoe (Hibiscus elatus)

This tree is known for the blue-green and yellow colour tones and the variety of the grain of the wood. You can see evidence of this in many curio stores throughout the island as craftsmen and cabinet makers use the wood in their craft. The tree is also used for reforestation and is regarded as one of Jamaica's primary economic timbers.



NATIONAL BIRD

Doctor Bird (Trochilus polytmus) or Swallowtail Hummingbird

We know the 'Doctor Bird' or Swallowtail Humming Bird. This bird is noted for its beautiful iridescent colours and is found only in Jamaica. It is perhaps the most outstanding of the 320 species of humming birds.

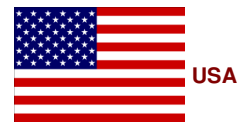
